Venue

Faculty of Dentistry Auditorium (Level 4), National University Hospital

Please note that the venue for the seminar is situated in National University Hospital and not the new Dental School building. The Hospital is conveniently accessible by Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) at Kent Ridge Station.

PSS Membership

The annual membership fee is S\$50 for Ordinary and Associate members and S\$25 for Student members, with a one-time entrance fee of S\$100. As a member, you will receive notices of PSS seminars, pay members' rate to the annual Advanced Restorative Course and other PSS seminars.

Registration

Singapore voltage is 220-240 volts AC, 50Hz. The power plugs are of the three-pin, square-shaped type. Most hotels will provide transformers to visitors on request.

Mobile network

The mobile phone networks available are - GSM900, GSM1800, 3G UTMS2100, 4G LTE1800, and LTE2600. Prepaid data SIM cards are available at Singapore Changi Airport, 7-Eleven stores and other retail outlets. There are also Wireless@SG Hotspots all around Singapore, but you would need to register for an account first before you can use.

Money

The official currency is Singapore Dollars. Notes come in 2, 5, 10, 50, 100, 500, 1000 and 10000. Coins come in 5c, 10c, 20c, 50c and \$1. Currency exchange facilities are available in airport, banks, most hotels and money-changers. Exchange rates tend to vary, so ask first. All major credit cards are widely accepted.

SPEAKER



Dr Nicola Ursula Zitzmann received her Board Examination and Dental Degree at the University of Aachen, Germany in 1991, finished her doctoral dissertation in 1992 and worked as an assistant in private practice for 2.5 years. From 1994 to 1997, she completed the postgraduate program at the Department of Fixed and Removable Prosthodontics and Dental Material Sciences in Zurich, Switzerland (Prof. P. Schärer). From 1997, she worked as Assistant Professor at the Department of Fixed and Removable Prosthodontics and TMJ Disorders at the University of Basel (Switzerland, Prof. C.P. Marinello) and completed the specialist training in Reconstructive Dentistry

in 2001. She finished her rehabilitation thesis (equivalent to Ph.D.) titled "Prosthodontic treatment of the edentulous patient with particular consideration given to implant-supported restorations" in 2004. Dr Nicola Zitzmann has been a Visiting Assistant at the Department of Periodontology at the University of Göteborg, Sweden (Profs. J. Lindhe and T. Berglundh), and achieved her Ph.D. degree in the field of Periodontology in 2006. Currently, she is Professor at the Clinic for Periodontology, Endodontology and Cariology at the University of Basel (and representative of the head of the Department, Prof. R. Weiger). She is an ITI fellow and education delegate for Switzerland, board member of the International College of Prosthodontists, and member of the Swiss Society of Periodontology (SSP) and the Swiss Society of Reconstructive Dentistry (SSRD).

SYNOPSIS

Prosthodontists face the difficult task of judging the influence and significance of multiple risk factors of periodontal, endodontic, or prosthetic origin that can affect the prognosis of an abutment tooth. In the first part, critical factors involved in deciding whether a questionable tooth should be treated and maintained, or extracted and possibly replaced by dental implants, will be discussed. In general, tooth maintenance and the acceptance of risks are suitable when: the tooth is not extensively diseased; the tooth has a high strategic value, particularly in patients with implant contraindications; the tooth is located in an intact arch; and the preservation of gingival structures is paramount. When complete-mouth restorations are planned, the strategic use of dental implants and smaller units (short-span fixed dental prostheses), either tooth- or implant-supported, as well as natural tooth abutments with good prognoses for long-span FPDs, is recommended to minimize the risk of failure of the entire restoration. Treatment planning will also be discussed for the partially and edentulous jaw focussing on indications for fixed or removable restorations. Further, prosthodontists should be aware of biological and technical implant complications knowing that their diagnosis, treatment and prevention of are essential for the long-term success of the oral rehabilitation.
